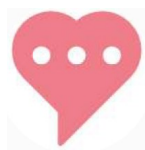


The Rights of the Child

Women do not always have the opportunity to access their basic rights. This can be due to social structures, traditions, stereotypes, and attitudes. Every Woman and child in Australia has the right to feel safe and valued in their own home and community.

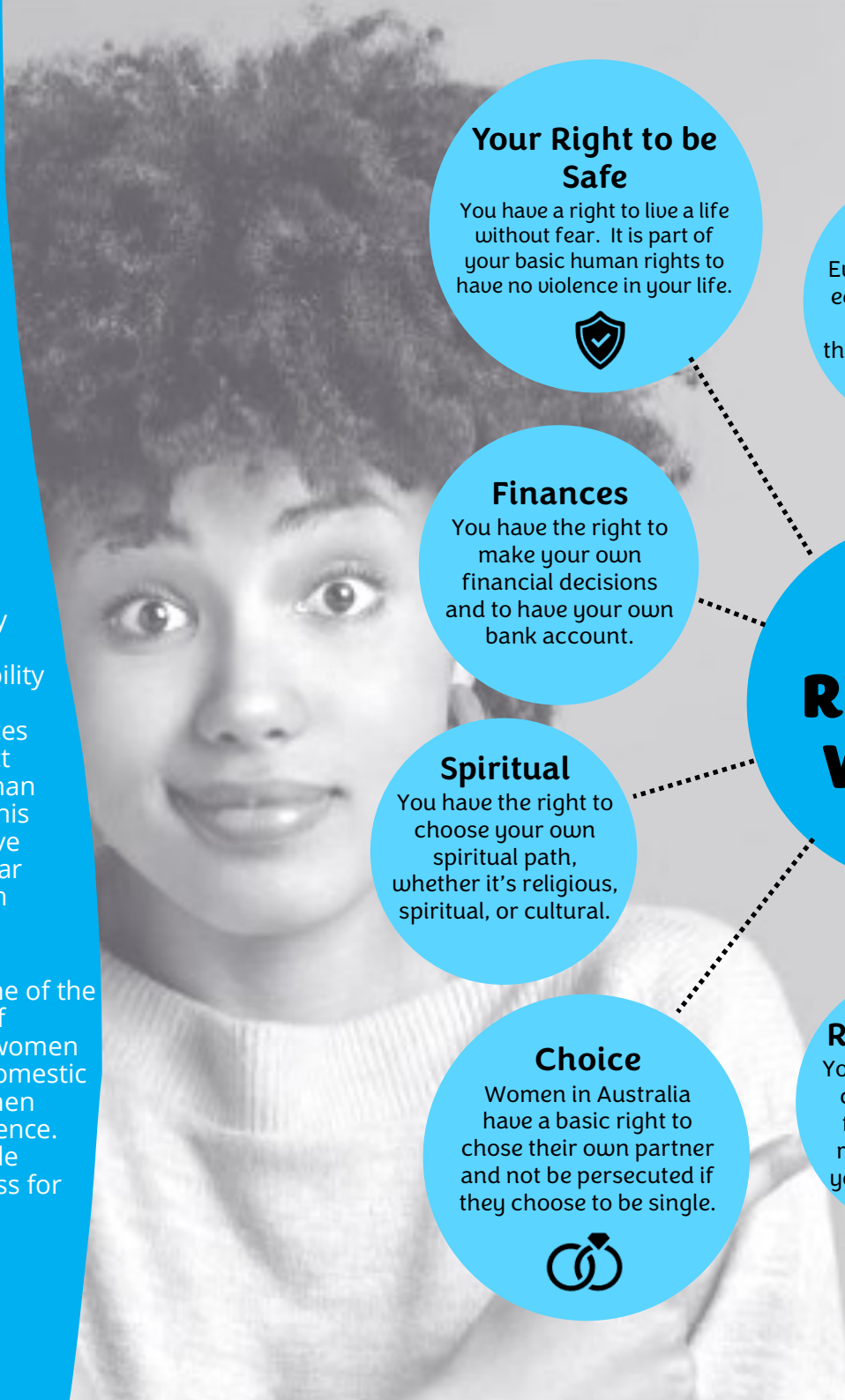
Women's rights are human rights and we have come a long way in the last 100 years however there are still many areas in our society where women and girls experience unequal treatment.

Social structures, traditions, stereotypes, cultural expectations, and attitudes toward women mean that we do not always have the same opportunities and abilities to access and enforce our rights on the same basis as males.

The gender pay gap has many contributing factors and discrimination, a lack of flexibility to accommodate family responsibilities, and differences in education influence the fact women are paid 17.5% less than men doing the same work. This gap means women would have to work an extra 64 days a year to get the same pay as men in the same role.

Violence against women is one of the most widespread breaches of human rights. One in three women in Australia will experience domestic violence, and one in five women have experienced sexual violence. Domestic Violence is the single biggest cause of homelessness for Australian women.

Your Right to be Safe

You have a right to live a life without fear. It is part of your basic human rights to have no violence in your life.



Equality

Every woman has an equal opportunity to make the most of their lives and talents.

Discrimination

You have the same rights as a male, and people should not make decisions or assumptions about you because you are female.



Your Body

You have the right to solely make any decisions about what happens to your body.

Education

Every Australian has the right to access free education. Women have the same access as men.



You can say NO

You are allowed to say no to anything that you are not comfortable with. It is part of your basic rights to make choices that are best for you.

Basic Rights of Women

Finances

You have the right to make your own financial decisions and to have your own bank account.

Spiritual

You have the right to choose your own spiritual path, whether it's religious, spiritual, or cultural.

Choice

Women in Australia have a basic right to choose their own partner and not be persecuted if they choose to be single.



Relationships

You have the right to choose your own friends and have relationships with your family at your leisure.
